About the Terri Clark Ministries in Uganda Child Sponsorship Program:

Because of the HIV/AIDS pandemic in Africa, nearly all of the children registered in this program have known death and disease first hand. They have lost parents and relatives to the ravages of poverty and disease. Education isn't free in the poor African nation of Uganda. Parents and guardians struggle to feed their families and cannot afford to educate them.

A child's academic scores determine which schools they are permitted to attend. The better a child scores in their exams, the better the school. Opportunities lie on their willingness to work hard. Every child wants to go to the best schools because they know a good education will lift them out of the cycle of poverty. These children consider it a privilege to go to school and they work very hard to do their best academically. For just \$20 per month, (\$240 per year), a child can receive a year's worth of schooling to help him out of the cycle of poverty. Instead of receiving a "handout," they receive a "hand up" to a better life.

Through this program, the destitute poor receive hope for their future.
